During the week of March 9th - 13th I have been in third thru fifth grade. We have continued to work on life changes and loss. In third grade, we watched a video on grief when a loved one passes away. We also discussed questions revolving around a wake and funeral. In fourth grade, we watched a video of a young girl who lost her dad while serving in Iraq. We discussed what her coping skills were and generated a list of five coping skills that they could utilize in a time of need. In fifth grade the students learned the five stages of grief (denial, anger, bargaining, depression, and acceptance) by the theorist Elizabeth Kubler-Ross. The students also generated ideas of how they could move past and make themselves feel better when in one of the five stages. Next week I will be work-

ing with small groups.

Tips for Parents: Ways to decrease stress while grieving:

- * 35% decrease stress by writing thoughts and feelings
- * 35% decrease stress by talking into a tape recorder, listening decreased stress by another 5%
- * 25% decrease stress by walking the equivalency of a mile a day
- * 50% decrease stress by talking and sharing with people who don't judge or advise
